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b) Revision of Existing Criteria for Recruitment

The STEVTA Board in its 26th Meeting, held on 18th March 2020 had approved the criteria for recruitment in Sindh TEVTA (subject to domicile, minimum qualification, experience and age requirements as per recruitment rules) as mentioned in the Working Paper which needs to be revised in the light of Recruitment Policy 2023 of SGA&CD, Govt. of Sindh and the written test conducted by the Sukkur IBA (SIBA) with 100 marks paper. The following criteria for recruitment of all posts, including the posts already advertised in newspapers is proposed (subject to domicile, minimum qualification, experience and age requirements as per recruitment rules):

i) Teaching/Non-Teaching (BS-06 above)

The Board after detailed discussion approved the criteria for recruitment as suggested by Secretary, Information Technology and Chairman SBTE as under:-

The marks awarded to the candidates by SIBA out of 100 will be considered as final marks for screening/ consideration, but the candidates with marks below the threshold of (40 marks for non-teaching & 50 marks for teaching) will not be considered for interview as already approved in 26th BoG.

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04	Upgradation of Institutes	<p>The Managing Director apprised to the Board that the Sindh Assembly passed an Act on 06-06-2016, to establish the University of Technology at the premises of Govt. College of Technology, Khairpur, namely "The Benazir Bhutto Shaheed University of Technology and Skill Development (BBSUTSD)", consequently, there is no Govt. College of Technology, in the Sukkur division.</p> <p>He further informed the Board members that</p>	<p>The Board after detailed discussion and deliberation, approved the upgradation of institutes along with SNE as proposed for further process, after completing all required formalities. 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the Mirpurkhas Division comprises of large area and especially after discovery of Coai in Thar, this division needs attention in terms of technical education and skill development. Presently, there is no Govt. College of Technology in Mirpurkhas Division, therefore, the Govt. Polytechnic Institute, Mirpurkhas (Boys) which has sufficient building, area and staff needs to be upgraded as GCT.

Furthermore, the Managing Director, STEVTA informed the Board that there is only one Govt, College of Technology for women in the province i-e Govt. College of Technology (W), Karimabad Karachi which does not cater the requirement for imparting quality technical education for the advance level to female students for the rest of province. Therefore, the GPI (W) Latifabad, Hyderabad which has the required infrastructure and fulfils the requirement of upgradation as GCT (W) at Hyderabad.

Accordingly, he requested the STEVTA Board to approve the upgradation of GPI (B) Sukkur as GCT Sukkur, GPI (B) Mirpurkhas as GCT Mirpurkhas, GPI (W) Latifabad Hyderabad as GCT (W) Latifabad Hyderabad and other proposed GMIs to GPIs with the overall financial implication of about Rs.486.78 Million, which will be met out from STEVTA's own funds.

Mr Asif Ikram however, was of the view that institutes proposed for GCT need capacity building before upgrading these as GCTs. The Managing Director, STEVTA while responding to the concerns of Secretary (IT), clarified the position that required facilities in terms of equipment and faculty are already available there; whereas the remaining formalities will be completed during the course affiliation etc.

d) The Sindh Tech Valley has requested for collaboration with STEVTA for provision and introduction of demand driven programs at different institutes of STEVTA for enhancement of technical education and skill development for youth of Sindh.

e) The management of Qalandar Shahbaz University has submitted proposal for collaboration with STEVTA in respect of Government Monotechnic Institute (Boys), Tando Muhammad Khan for working together with STEVTA to provide quality technical education to the youth of the area.

Previously, the proposal of the University after completing required codal formalities was approved by the Competent Authority on Public-Private-Partnership mode which was however, subsequently withdrawn by the competent authority.

f) The Sindh Economic Welfare Association (SEWA), a registered organization has submitted a proposal of collaboration for adoption of Government Vocational Training Centre (Girls), Qasimabad, Hyderabad for Skill Development and provision of quality technical & vocational education to the girls of the area.
